for damages and attorney fees.

The 1943 decision in West Virginia State Board of Education v. Barnette, 319 U.S. 624, held that public school students cannot be forced to participate in the Pledge of Allegiance exercise. Mandatory participation violates students' free speech rights under the First orstandent of the U.S. Constitution. Students cannot be forced to stand or leave the room, and they should not be harassed, questioned, disciplined, or pressured in any way for their decision to boycott the Pledge.
